<u>Rules of Publication in Hermes</u>

Hermes is an academic refereed Journal specialized in human and social sciences. It is a means to open a channel of academic communication between people having interest in this field. Hermes publishes research reports; theoretical approaches; academic reviews; minutes of meetings and conferences; and specialized book reviews.

Terms of Publication:

- $\circ~$ Publishable works should be related to human and social sciences.
- Works should be compliant with academic methods.
- Research, theoretical approach or scientific review is to be of 30 pages, a conference report of about 15 pages and a book review of around 10 pages.
- The publishable work should not have been published or be published by another body at the same time.
- Presented research and theoretical approaches are to be accompanied by Arabic and English abstracts of about 250 or 300 words each.
- Publishable works should be compliant with the rules of MLA, with regard to articulating the reference citations of humanities, and APA, with regard to social sciences.
- A publishable work is presented as a paper copy and a soft copy on a CD.
- $\circ~$ Images and diagrams are to be presented for printing.
- Works presented are to be refereed according to the Journal's policy.
- o Publishable works express the opinions of their authors.
- Works which are not accepted for publication are not returned to their authors.

Studies reflect their authors' points of view, and their organization is subject to technical considerations.
