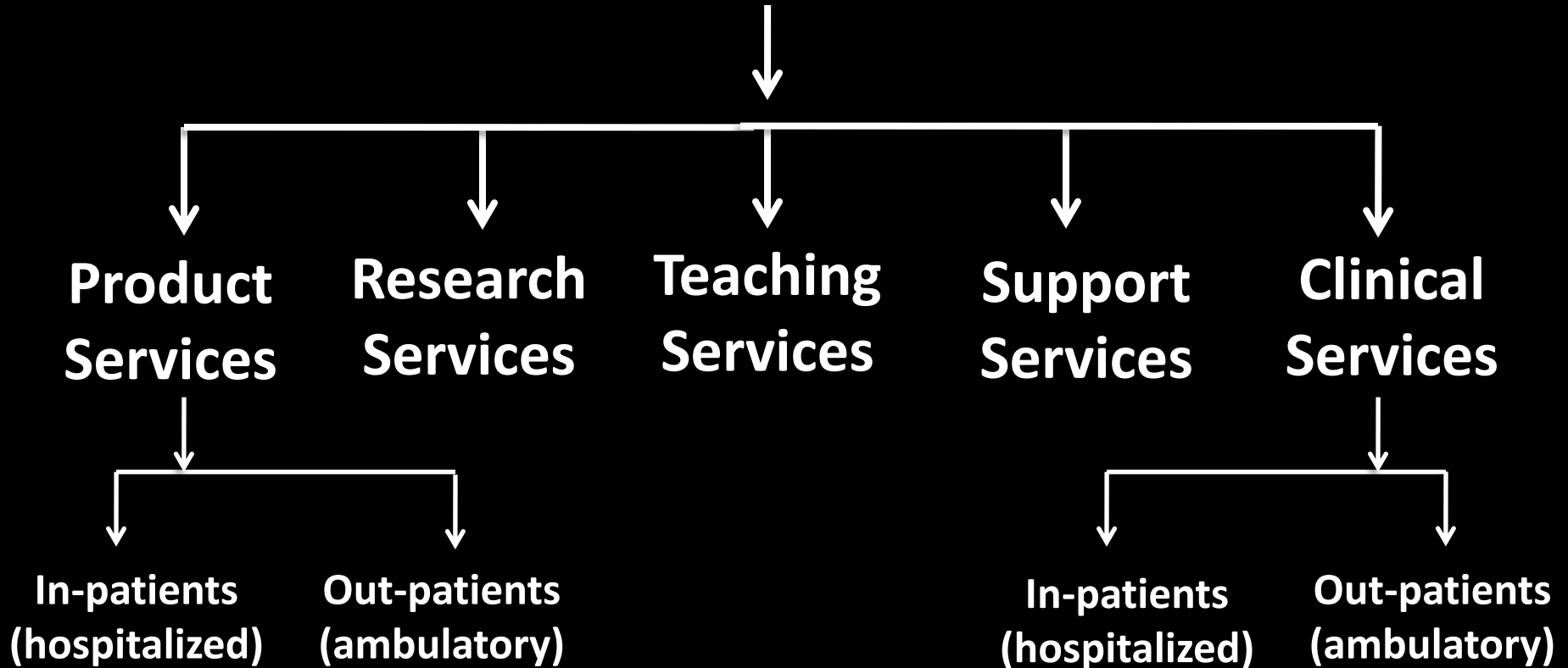

Pharmaceutical Services Offered in Hospitals

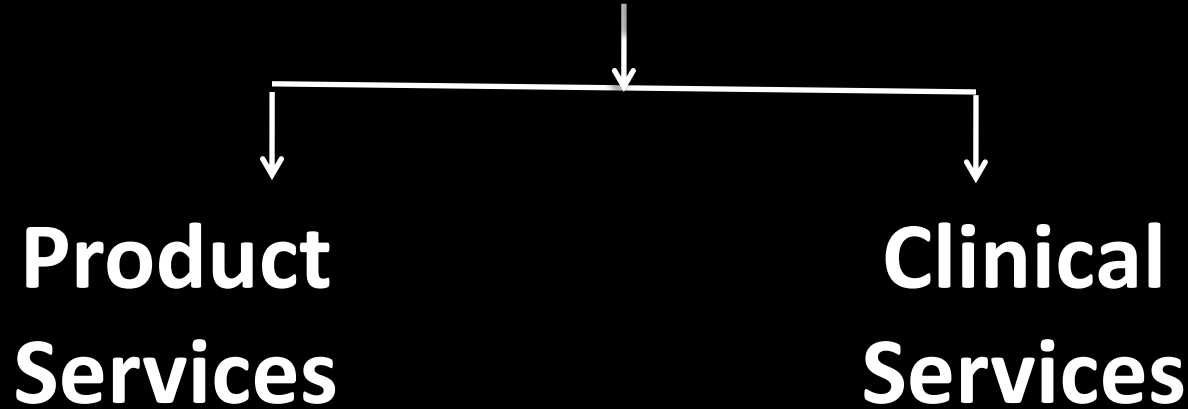


Out patients

- *Hospital employees with a prescription service**
