Dr. Salman graduated from the College of Economics and Political Science in 1994 and was one of the first to graduate. He obtained a Master's degree in political science from the college in 1998 with an excellent grade with first class honors, with a recommendation to print the dissertation at the university's expense. In 2005, he obtained a Doctorate of Philosophy in political science on the subject: "Scarce of Water Resources and International Conflict: A Case Study of the Nile River Basin," from the Faculty of Economics and Political Science at Cairo University, with a recommendation to print the thesis and exchange it with other universities. The thesis won the award for the best thesis discussed at Cairo University in 2005.
